FUNERAL NOTICE.

The friends of the late Arthur Martin are respectfully invited to follow his remains to their last resting place, Whroo Cemetery. The funeral will leave his late residence, Bailieston, on Friday, 27th inst., at 1 o'clock.

The friends of Mr Arthur Martin, of Bailieston, will regret to hear of his death on Tuesday last, at the comparatively early age of 64 years. The deceased arrived at Whroo 32 years ago, and worked on the famous Balaclava Hill for about four years, when he removed to Coy's Diggings [Bailieston], and remained there up to the time of his death.

In the early days Mr Martin was very successful in mining, but latterly, as has been the experience of many old pioneers, fortune failed to smile upon him.

Of late he had been in the employ of the Goe-Carr Company as caretaker of the mine.

His remains will be interred in the Whroo Cemetery to-day (Friday), leaving Bailieston at 1 o'clock.
